SHELBY SERIES ONE THE MARRIAGE OF SHELBY AMERICAN AND OLDSMOBILE

As most of you know Hans Hermann and his wife Linda attended the February Club meeting and spoke about our upcoming Ruble Castle Tour and their 1999 Shelby Series One. In case you didn't know the Series One is significant to Oldsmobile because all 249 examples were outfitted with the Oldsmobile Aurora 403 (4.0L V8 DOHC 32 Valves) and a 6-speed manual Transmission. 1994 is when the development of the Series One began. Because Ford would not let Shelby use a Cobra or Snake related name thus came the addition of the Olds 403 to the production of the Series One. The production years were 1999-2005. The Olds Aurora 4.0L L47 has a base horsepower of 320 and torque numbers right around 290 ft lbs. Top speed is 170 mph (which is faster than the 427 Shelby Cobra) and runs the quarter mile in 12.8 seconds at 112mph. There was a supercharged version that boasts numbers of 450 HP and 11.35 standing quarter mile time. Only 30 of the cars produced were supercharged. Many of the interior components came from GM also. Pontiac instrument cluster, Buick cassette/CD player and other components.

In 1992 the Series One became the brain-child of Oldsmobile GM John Rock and Carroll Shelby. Rock promised Shelby 1 million for development. The two wanted 50 Oldsmobile Dealerships to put down \$50,000 and sell 5 cars giving each dealership \$450,000 in profit. Only 16 dealerships signed up.

Browning Oldsmobile now Chevrolet in Cerritos actually has The Series One production number 003 with just 100 original miles.

Since the car was the 1st of the Shelby/Oldsmobile program it was called the Series One which is the Roadster and Series Two was to be the Coupe. It was 1st shown at the Olds exhibit at the LA Auto Show in 1997. All cars were to be painted Oldsmobile Centennial Silver with a red, white or blue stripe. The projected price for the Series One was \$106,975. Hans's and Linda's car was ordered by the original owner in November 1998 and then delivered August 2000.

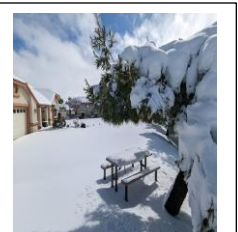
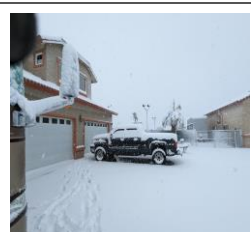
Hans shared with the group that he acquired the Series One from his brother about a year ago. His brother Roland received delivery of the car in 2014 with just 2110 miles. The car was then shipped to Hans and Linda from Texas in California in 2022 with just 5824 original miles. Hans's and Linda's Series One is production number 078.

Linda shared with the group a Carroll Shelby tidbit that was quite interesting.

As you all know Carroll Shelby almost always signed all of his Shelby cars whether it be a Cobra or a Mustang as well as other memorabilia. He would always put a line under his signature. What we didn't know is that line can tell you an approximate time as to when he signed his name. Before 1990 there was no slash in the middle of the line under his name. If there is no slash through the middle of the underline that signature was signed before his heart transplant in 1990. Afterwards he included one slash through the underline. In 1996 Carroll had a kidney transplant. The kidney was donated by his son Michael. After the kidney transplant Carroll placed 2 slashes through the underline of his name. So if you ever see A Carroll Shelby signature you can get a good idea of when it was actually signed.

Thanks again to Hans and Linda for sharing their story with the club. It was an exciting and informational day for us all.

Grant and I enjoyed our 4 days of snow. Here are a few pictures of Waner Ranch 2.0 covered in SNOW.

MEMBERS SPOTLIGHT
DAVE WALTERS

My story begins in Brooklyn NY where I was born the third of five children. I had a great rambunctious childhood and I think I would not have wanted to grow up anywhere else. I went through the normal school years and did fairly well.

After high school I enrolled in Pace college in NYC studying computer operation and computer programming, this was a two-year course. I subsequently got my first job in this field. This, however, didn't last very long because Uncle Sam came calling, yep, I got my draft notice.

I was inducted into the US Army and was sent to Fort Jackson in South Carolina for basic training and then Fort Sill Oklahoma for advanced training in artillery. After a two week leave I reported to Fort Ord prior to being shipped to Nam and then finding out I was now in the infantry. I spent thirteen months in Nam and was lucky to survive in one piece, even surviving a bout with malaria.

After discharge from the regular army, I enlisted in the National Guard since I still had four years of obligation to the military and I figured this was the best way to never have to go back to Nam.

About six months after being discharged from the army I found out about a new federal job being created called the Federal Air Marshal program, so I applied and was accepted. During my time in this work I meet my future wife, Marianne and we were married two years later. Best thing that has happened to me to the present day. We subsequently had two boys over the span of a number of years.

I left the Air Marshal service after four and a half years and shortly my wife, son and I moved to California. I worked in the computer field for a couple of years and decided to try my hand at law enforcement. I was hired by OCSD and worked the jails and street for just over nine years and decided I had enough.

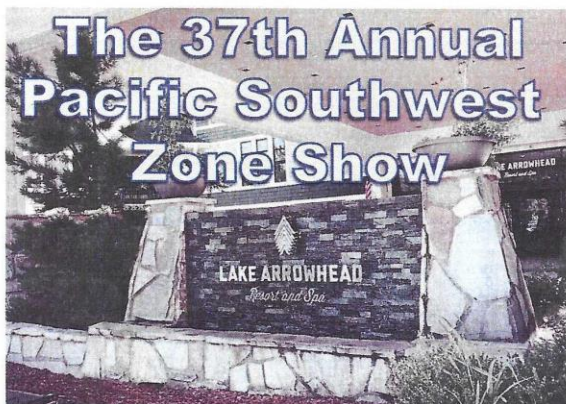
I was hired in a IT position by Yamaha Motor Corp. and over the course of many years worked my way up to operations manager. I retired in 2010 and I have been happily unemployed ever since.

My Oldsmobile experience in the club began in 1997 when I ran into Butch Williams at the Long Beach auto swap and he informed me about the club, so I joined! That was convenient timing since it happened to be the 100th anniversary of Oldsmobile. I had a 1973 Olds Omega Hatch Back which my wife had been driving for seventeen years driving back and forth to school where she taught elementary school. I had to pry the Omega from her so I bought her another car (Toyota Camry), so I could go to Lansing for the 100th celebration. That trip was great fun, driving in convoy with my fellow Olds Club members. The Omega which I have to this day is my only Oldsmobile currently. I have owned three other prior Oldsmobile's, another 1973 Omega four door, which I drove cross country when I came to California, a 1975 Delta 88 and a 1978 Delta 88, which were pretty good cars, considering the cars that were being produced by GM in that time period.

I have been participating in the club consistently and I have enjoyed my time in the club, having participated in five national meets and I have lost count in how many zone and local shows over the years I have attended. I think I reached the pinnacle in my membership, when in 2018 my Omega won the Best of Show at the zone show in Clovis, that was a very kind move by Norcal and SoCal Olds leadership. I am currently holding a board position in the SoCal club as area representative which I have held for many years.

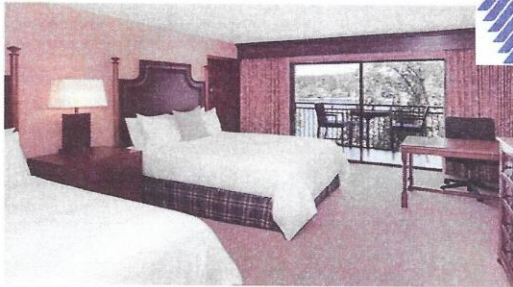

It was noted that we enjoyed our guest speaker's presentation. Warner Ranch 2.0 discussion and funding approval for morning and afternoon food noted funds have been approved for this event. Randy spoke about the need to provide carpooling for our members who may not be driving anymore. The April Lions flyer will be posted in the newsletter for April 15th and any updates needed will be noted. Randy called on anyone on the board to volunteer for a Members Spotlight for next month. Dave Walters volunteered to be next. In the following month another board member Keith Berg will do his writeup. Member Kim Tucker asked to host an event at his home, looks like will be in June. Look for a flyer. His home is near the Griffith Observatory. Randy provided a sheet of events ideas he downloaded from published sources under consideration for future event. Randy suggested we move our meeting around hoping to get others to attend. It was noted during the conversation that moving the meeting often may not be good for attendance. Members may not follow the changes. It could be confusing. The conversation was tabled. Last up the CHAFFEY COLLEGE 12TH ANNUAL CAR SHOW "SUNDAY April 16th from ten to two. The last discussion centered around finances. **Tabled** to another meeting was should we raise our dues for next year 12-1-2024. It has been suggested that we raised to \$20.00. We will poll of members at the next our club gathering. The memorial picnic cost was discussed. Do we want to include a catered lunch again? That would increase the cost and the fees. Do we raise meal cost to entrants to cover lunch? Do we provide 1 or 2 lunches per entrant? One proposal motion would be to charge \$25.00 for a first meal and \$15.00 for each added meal. The last years vendor cost around \$2,900. That was for our special anniversary event. The discussion noted it would be too high of an expense for this year. 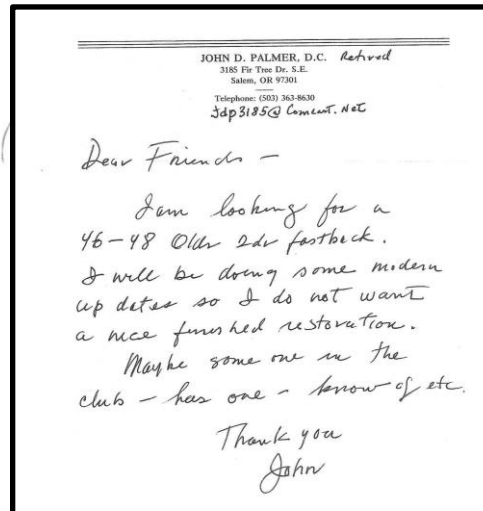
