

Board Meeting Minutes


Membership Meeting 11/04/2023 scribed by Secretary Domenic Santucci

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

Julius Bognar & Sons

What started out as a teenage fascination with a '57 holiday coupe owned by one of my father's gas station customers in NW Indiana, eventually ended up with us finding and restoring this '70 442 Pace Car that is now one of three that we own. The other two....an '86 cutlass/442 and a '72 Cutlass Supreme (U code) are now in various stages of repair/restoration. After that initial contact with that '57 (my Dad charged me with keeping

that Olds in "spotless condition", I never thought I could afford one, but I really thought the two-tone combination of grey/white with the chromed red accent sweeping back on the quarter panel was super "cool." I've never seen another one in that color combination "in person."


Fast forward to College /US Army/Marriage/move to So Cal where I accepted an engineering position with Edison working on the construction of San Onofre units 2&3. With 3 boys to raise, my wife Jeannine and I knew there would be the day when we would hear the inevitable ... " I want to get my driver's license!". But even before the oldest, Jay (Julius Jr.) was ready to look for his own first daily driver, my wife was ready for a new car as the '77 Camaro that I bought new for her birthday was too hard to enter and exit when she was in her 8th mo. with son no. 3, Jonas. The answer was a '79 Cutlass Supreme that I bought new from Bob Black Olds in Santa Ana. Apparently, that must have influenced Jay as he later found an original owner '70 442 conv. (white top, gold/white) But it didn't take long to spin a bearing and we had to do a bottom end rebuild. Being heavier than a coupe, it proved a good choice, however, as sure enough another 16 yr old turned right in front of him on the way to school one morning and he destroyed the kid's Chev. Luv truck's r.f. suspension. Jay walked away without a scratch but the other driver hit the windshield and was injured (Jay was not wearing his seat belt). Lessons learned for both him and his brothers....always wear your seat belt/be alert for unsafe drivers/stick with cars that can absorb a hit (no "mini" trucks or cheap Hondas!)"

After collecting the insurance \$\$ (they actually totaled it) he found a '72 Cutlass Supreme U code conv. white top, red/black, sold that and eventually bought and sold the following....70 W30 4speed, '76 442 w/factory 455/ '71 Cutlass Sup./ '79 Hurst Olds/ '87 442/ '79 Cutlass Calais/ '94 Cut. Sup. SL DOHC V6/ and a '95 Aurora. Obviously, he got serious about any and all Oldsmobiles. Besides helping him acquire/maintain/repair/sell this collection, I too, gradually became more involved financially and legally until he was "on his own". As stated above, he now just owns the '86 442 and the '72 Cutlass Supreme U code.

When it came to his brother, Lee's "turn" he was very much influenced by Jay's first one (the gold 442 conv. and then the red Cutlass conv.) that he immediately set his sights on getting his own when he turned 16 and got his license. Since this was before the advent of the internet, he had to rely on local ads and Club members' leads. His first was an original owner gold 442 Holiday coupe (no W25 hood)) belonging to the owner of the Wertz Candy of Pasadena. He actually drove it ,along with his brother's red cutlass conv. to the Nationals in San Jose in '86. On a whim he enters it in the Unrestored Class and won 2nd place!. After selling it for a profit, he then moved on to a Rallye 350, and then sold that for a profit. Using this "bank" he the set out to find his ultimate goal the '70 Pace Car you now see at club outings. It was guite an adventure for a high school Junior back in the summer of 1986. Since I had to sign for and surreptitiously become the "owner" all I had to do was complete the restoration as it looks today (only took 27years!) and have the privilege to drive it and show it. That complete journey is a story for another time. Son no. 3 (Jonas) turned out to be the only one not to own an Olds. However, he did benefit from me and his brothers supplying him with '70 and '71 Cutlass "beaters" that served him well all thru high school and college. They were indestructible! Because of his current commute to West LA he wisely bought a (gasp!) Toyota Hybrid. So that leaves the '70 442 Pace Car as the only currently drivable Olds in the family....but the others are getting there!

Ask Your Zone Director

It's getting to be OCA Board election time again! The first step in the election process is the nomination of candidates for all offices. Nominations are being accepted through December 30th. For more information on the election process and how to become a candidate, please see the article on page 7 of the November issue of Journey With Olds or contact me.

The latest OCA Board Zoom videoconference was held on Nov. 1st, with eighteen attendees. President Sal chaired the meeting.

Treasurer Jeff compared the 2023 year-to-date finances against the same period in 2022. Looking at club operations excluding the National Meet, our operating losses have increased this year, mainly due to increased printing, postage, and distribution costs for Journey With Olds (JWO). However, the financial success of this year's Meet should put our total finances on the positive side again, provided there are no major unexpected expenses or loss in revenue during the last two months of this year. Jeff noted that the monthly printing paper surcharge that we have been paying hit a maximum earlier this year and is declining.

The Club finances discussion continued with Jeff outlining the need for a review of and possible adjustment of our JWO advertising rates. He also reviewed the ongoing discussions regarding possible changes to our agreement with Brave Marketing Concepts (our Club merchandise supplier) and tightening up our billing/payment system for commercial advertisers to ensure timely payments are made to OCA.

2024 National Meet Update: Based on attendee feedback this year, a different approach to Meet activities will be taken. Many comments were received about too many activities, so there will be a free day (Thursday) during the 2024 Meet; the only activity scheduled for Thursday will be the evening Meet & Greet/Welcome Reception.

Vice President Bob announced that there will be racing at the National Meet as part of the program. Racing will be on Friday afternoon/evening at Ozark Raceway. GBodyParts & Fusick will again be sponsors of the racing event.

Hotel information and the Meet registration form are scheduled to be in the February 2024 issue of JWO.

Chief Judge Brian reviewed the revised Street Stock Class language, which seeks to clarify the difference between the Street Stock and Modified Classes. Revisions to the judging rules to improve readability and add some new items are upcoming. It was suggested that language also be added to require judged cars be left on the show field for a specified amount of time so that the cars can be viewed, weather permitting.

Website: Different software is being considered for our website and membership records. Currently-used software Your Membership is not meeting all of our needs, so Cornerstone software is being examined to see if it would better suit us. Webmaster Stefan noted that the Cadillac LaSalle Club (CLC) recently successfully transitioned from Your Membership to Cornerstone. (Stefan is also the CLC Webmaster.) Also noted that the Buick Club of America uses Cornerstone.

Miscellaneous Items: OCA has 4,125 members at present. Olds Club of Wisconsin has 180 members, which is an all-time high. The '57 Chapter is closing in on 300 members. Inquiries from members in Indianapolis, IN and Charlotte, NC have been received regarding restarting or forming chapters- Zone Directors to follow up. President Sal noted that the Request For Proposal for the 2025 National Meet should be released in a few weeks.
