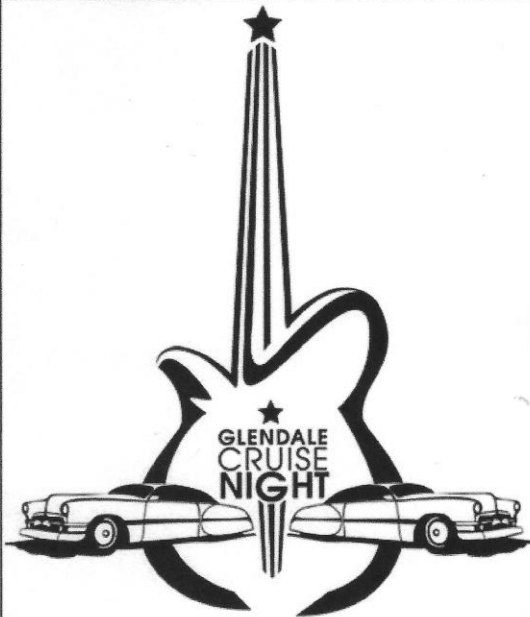

LIABILITY RELEASE-CITY OF GLENDALE-CRUISE NIGHT, SATURDAY, JULY 16, 2016

1. Damage, Loss, Vandalism, or Theft to Participant's Car.

A. The Participant's car and any accompanying parts, equipment, or accessories (collectively, "Car") will be displayed outdoors at the Cruise Night event, but the Car will not be monitored or guarded by the City's staff. The Car may be viewed by the public at any time of day or night, and the public may walk around the Car. The Participant understands and acknowledges that a risk of damage, loss, vandalism, or theft is inherent in a public display. If the Participant has property or casualty insurance that covers the Car, and if damage, loss, vandalism, or theft occurs to the Participant's Car while it is on display at the Cruise Night event, then the Participant must seek payment or reimbursement from the Participant's insurance company, whose insurance coverage is primary to the City's self-insurance program and the City's other insurance policies.

B. The Participant (a) releases and holds harmless, (b) will not make a claim against or sue, and (c) waives a right of recovery against: the City and its officers, agents or employees for damage or vandalism to, or loss or theft of, one or more of the Participant's Cars, arising out of a negligent or intentional act- or other act, however caused - of one or more persons, or members of the public, at the Cruise Night event.

2. Indemnification of City for Participant's Displaying Car at Cruise Night Event. The Participant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City and its officers, agents, employees, and representatives from and against any and all claims, demands, lawsuits, causes of action, injuries, damages, costs, fees, or expenses arising out of an act, error, or omission by the Participant; or by an agent, employee, or representative of the Participant; or by both, while the Participant displays a Car at the Cruise Night event.
